Open 6 days a week, Monday - Saturday

Open 24/7 online for searching through catalogs, placing holds, downloading digital content such as: movies, audio books, music, etc.

Direct access to 10 million items through CLEVNET, a sharing system of 44 library systems. This includes books, ebooks, DVD's, music CD's, streaming videos, 75 research databases, and online newspapers. All can be accessed from home or at the library.

#### The levy is...

a continuing levy that is needed for the library to continue its current services.

#### How much will you pay?

\$4.38 per month for a home valued at \$100,000.

#### Why is the levy needed?

To make up for lost income from state cuts. State Funding (PLF) has fluctuated between a 16%-31% loss over the past 10 years. Without levy funds, library services will decrease.

### What is your return on investment?

#### **OHIO LIBRARIES RETURN ON INVESTMENT**

For every \$1 spent on Ohio public libraries, patrons receive \$5.48 in economic value.



## Unexpected Expenses in the Past Year:

- Hot water tank installed at Welcome Center
- Hot water tank installed at library
- 2 toilets replaced at library
- Broken main water line replaced at library
- Aging commercial door locks replaced in 2 areas

## Expenses Held in Check by:

- Not replacing retired staff
- Not reinstating staff health insurance for more than a decade
- Minimally maintaining property, facilities and equipment
- Cancellation of some magazine subscriptions
- Deferred replacement of old furniture
- Deferred replacement of old equipment
- Writing grants to supplement the budget
